

Cofece submits for public consultation its Draft Modification to the Technical Criteria for the Request and Issuance of Interim Measures and Setting of Sureties

- *The modifications include the requirements for the acceptance, custody, return, and effectiveness of the guarantees granted as surety for the lifting of interim measures.*
- *The consultation will be open from today until October 10, 2024.*

Mexico City, August 28, 2024. The Federal Economic Competition Commission (Cofece or Commission) initiated a public consultation on its draft modification to the Technical Criteria of the Federal Economic Competition Commission for the Request and Issuance of Interim Measures, as well as for the Setting of Sureties.

The modifications to the Technical Criteria submitted for public consultation include, among other matters, the requirements for the acceptance, custody, return, and effectiveness of the guarantees in favor of the Commission, granted as surety for the lifting of interim measures.

For Cofece, it is important to know the opinions of economic agents, the private sector, and the public. Therefore, it opens a public consultation period of 30 business days, starting on August 28 and ending on October 10, 2024.
